


In the News

A Fresh Look

Drop in to any local car boot sale and you will often find Paint Pots team members rummaging for treasure, seeking out those items that are going to spark children's interests - empty picture frames, weighing scales, sugar shakers, pots, pans, fire cones and shells. We have started to add larger items to our list of finds, including dressers, tables, chairs, a piano! and other pieces of furniture that can be repurposed for use in our



preschools / nurseries, such as this 'paint station'. What an inviting way to store and display craft materials. Our children have responded enthusiastically to the new items and the opportunities to create using 'open-ended' resources, with renewed interest in transient art, sustained concentration, more use of imagination and some great



conversations. We are not throwing out all our plastic and we're not buying second hand bargains to save money! We're constantly looking at how we can challenge and support our children with environments and resources that encourage and enable them to develop their own creativity.

In, Out & About

David has had a busy schedule of speaking engagements this year including -

We have welcomed visitors from Lancaster University, University College London, a delegation from China, University College Birmingham, local providers, trainers and consultants who have all been interested in seeing Paint Pots in action.

David has attended sessions of the All Party Parliamentary Group for Early Years at the House of Commons to contribute to discussions with Ministers on the challenges facing our sector.

Training

Every year we bring all our teams together for an annual professional development day. This year we decided to use the expertise within our teams, to share best practice. To do so required significant logistics planning to ensure everyone moved between various Paint Pots locations across the city in a timely fashion. In various practical and workshop style sessions, groups discussed and learned more about -


A new Ofsted inspection framework, our curriculum and pedagogy; outdoor play and 'tough trays'; environment and provocations; parental engagement, building on children's interests and English as an Additional Language; Special Educational Needs and Disabilities; Paint Pots values; Boosting Language Auditory Skills and Talking (BLAST); and narrowing the language development attainment gap.

Paint Pots House continues to play host to monthly Paediatric First Aid courses, held on 2 consecutive Saturdays. Not only does this enable us to refresh training for every single member of our teams working with your children but we also make spaces available for other childcare providers in the area, particularly childminders who are grateful for the availability of reasonably priced training at a weekend when they are not working.

Paint Pots House training room is busier these days with various different organisations using it to deliver training sessions, including the Early Years Alliance, the National Day Nurseries Association, Early Excellence, other local childcare providers and Boogie Mites who continue to provide music and training for our active sessions with the children.

We have access to a wide range of online training and development resources. Our teams are encouraged and supported to complete various online training modules.

Our successful apprenticeship programme run in conjunction with our training partner Lifetime Training has really helped us to recruit for character—those men and women who have the best interests of children at heart. They are taught the fundamentals of child development, good care practice and the statutory requirements of their job role. They do so 'on the job' which means they learn Paint Pots values with the support of an experienced team. Our experience shows that here are many advantages to 'growing your own'.




In the last month -

- 7 dads have taken on sole care of their children and secured housing
- 1 grandmother has completed considerable work to keep her granddaughter safe in her care
- 9 grandparent carers have stated they have received the best support from our Carers Café
- 14 dads have achieved contact with their children.

And over the last year -

- 197 Special Guardianship Order grandparents have attended our support groups and events run together with Southampton City Partnership Team.
- 25 new referrals for dad's outreach have been received.
- 469 dads outreach sessions (some grandparents) have been achieved.
- 468 children and 419 dads, carers and grandparents have attended our groups.

We are delighted to have secured funding from the national lottery for a further year.



No Toys Week??

There is a well-known saying in Early Years: 'The more the toy does the less the child does.' We bear this in mind when providing a range of resources for your children. Occasionally we put away all the 'toys' in preparation for a week of activities based around simple open-ended resources such as sand, boxes, paint etc.

The children usually express their surprise on arrival - 'Where have all our toys gone?!' but they quickly embrace the opportunity to use their imagination, creativity, design and problem solving skills to explore and use whatever is available. Adults are on hand to co-create and to provide additional tools and resources as needed.

This tray originally contained pink and green sand before the children decided to mix the colours. Look at the concentration as he makes marks in the sand. What wonderful pre-writing practice! The sand was subsequently recycled and used in flour trays for more magical mark making (as fairy dust)!


Well-Being

To celebrate World Mental Health Day on 10th October, Paint Pots will be holding events at all of our settings. We will also be signing our Time to Change Employer Pledge – a commitment to changing the way we think and act about mental health in the workplace.

WELL-BEING THIS WAY

This commitment is supported by a 12-month employer action plan which supports Paint Pots putting in place best-practice interventions and policy to help our team work in ways that promote a positive mental wellbeing.

It is our intention to ensure that our motto of 'Love, Laughter and Learning' applies equally to our team members as it does to our children, with Love and Laughter occupying the 2 lowest and largest segments of our pyramid –



Our action plan includes -

- Management commitment to Time to Change
- Management attendance at well-being for managers course.
- Review of our policies
- Review return to work procedure following mental health illness.
- Signposting services to support mental health and well-being.
- Encouraging employees to openly talk about their well-being.
- Wellness Action Plans to be offered to all employees.
- Appoint well-being champions in each Paint Pots setting.
- Signing the pledge on World Mental Health Day
- Well-being champions to run events in their settings.
- Stress awareness as part of our mandatory training programme.
- Introduce well-being champions at induction.
- Employees to share coping strategies, stress awareness and relaxation techniques at staff meetings.
- Encourage normalisation of discussions on well-being matters.
- Case studies to be shared (with permission) with the wider team.
- Further training for managers return to work meetings following illness, guidance following a disclosure.
- Team newsletters and website area to have new well-being sections.

Young and Old

We love bringing the young and older generations together. Many of our preschools and nurseries arrange visits to their local care homes at different points of the year. A recent example was a visit to a monthly lunch club organized by Communicare. Our children had a great time joining in with their musical instruments to a local ukulele group. They were treated to apple pie and custard afterwards. It seems common sense that children and the elderly benefit from spending time with each other. It is sad that children and older people are often isolated from one another these days. We hope to develop more relationships by inviting older friends in to help us with gardening, reading stories and to share oth-er hobbies and interests with us. Music is definitely a great way of allowing everyone to join in to-gether. We are hoping to partner with Boogie Mites to share their particular repertoire of songs that our children already familiar with, with our elderly friends.



All Change

Southampton council told us at Easter of the plans to redevelop the St Marks school site in Shirley. At the same time they announced that we would have to move out by the end of July—not long to find a new location and organise a move. Very fortunately, Shirley Baptist Church in Freemantle had previously hosted a preschool and was looking for a new tenant.
